After a year on maternity leave, I returned to work at the beginning of November. The transition was as smooth as possible with the hand-off of ongoing projects from Barry McQuay, Acting Area Supervisor, and lots of support from Rideau Valley Conservation Authority staff members. I am looking forward to being back to my work at Foley Mountain with some new ideas and projects for the upcoming season. Thank you to Barry for bringing his wealth of knowledge and experience back to the mountain and doing a great job.

This winter has been perfect for enjoying the trails at Foley Mountain. With significant snowfall and few melts, there was plenty of opportunity for visitors to get out and snowshoe, ski, or hike. Thanks to the generous donation of 41 pairs of snowshoes from the Friends of Folev Mountain in 2007, two successful snowshoeing clinics were held in February each with a very different demographic of participants. first, held on a school PA day was mostly children aged four through seven who didn't complain at all

while trucking through some very deep snow! The second, held on a Thursday morning, was all adults who were mostly interested in trying out the new style of snowshoes. Although very different, both events were lots of fun with great weather conditions. More clinics will be planned for February 2012.

With spring quickly approaching, instructors from the Rideau Vallev Conservation Authority have been visiting local schools to present the Spring Water Awareness Program (SWAP). SWAP is a free program offered to schools in the Rideau River watershed that teaches students the danger of spring ice and water. The presentation includes discussion, a experiment where video. and students feel how cold spring water is and what effects it has on the body. This program is generously sponsored Ontario Power by Generation and reaches approximately 2000 students each year.

The spring and summer education programs are quickly approaching and teachers are already starting to call to book their class trips. The next few months will be busy with preparations for the programs and getting the park ready for summer visitors. With support from the Friends of Foley Mountain, a summer student will be hired to assist with planning and implementing the outdoor environmental education programs for schools and families. This summer, the Foley Mountain Summer Family Nature Programs will once again be held. The programs will be run most Tuesday and Thursday mornings in July and August


from 10:00am to 11:30am. There will also be a few trial full day programs available throughout the summer so keep checking our website (www.rvca.ca) for more information. In addition, the Interpretive Centre will be open most Tuesdays and Thursdays through Saturdays from 10:00am to 4:00pm during July and August.

Another project that is underway at the Rideau Valley Conservation Authority is the installation of pay and display systems at developed conservation areas. If all goes well, a unit will be installed at Foley Mountain. The unit will be located at the second picnic area where a gravel pull-in had previously been installed. The hope is that this unit will make it much easier and convenient for visitors to purchase both day and annual passes as credit card payment will be available.

With all of the recent grant dollars that have been generously donated to Foley Mountain Conservation Area, the Rideau Valley Conservation Authority and the Friends of Foley Mountain have decided to hold a Foley Mountain Community Conservation Celebration and barbeque to recognize all of our sponsors and partners as well as feature the many projects that have been happening at the park.
